A Posture for the Poor

It was another cold Christmas Day in Chicago and most families were sequestered together celebrating the holiday. We, too, were with family — our extended church family — as we gathered to celebrate Jesus' birth.

Even though it was some 30 years ago, I remember it well. During the service,

there was a knock on the door. We opened it to find several homeless brothers standing on the stairs looking for something to eat since food and shelter providers had closed down to observe Christmas.

Responding to the need, several of the sisters quickly went home and gathered food for an impromptu spread. The heartfelt response from our visitors was filled with gratitude — and the next week, they were back, bringing others with them. Week after week, they kept coming back, leading the church to establish a breakfast ministry.

The Christmas encounter inspired an outreach to the poor. God jumpstarted the process by bringing the vulnerable right to our doorstep. His intervention should be of no surprise because it reflects His tender heart for the poor. In fact, more than 2,000 verses directly teach us about God's heart for the poor, the needy, the orphan, and the widow.

In Romans 15:25-29, for instance, Paul writes that, after numerous delays, a door opened to finally visit the Italian city of Rome, in hopes of sharing the gospel. Although he intended to travel straight there, an unexpected surprise prompted a quick detour. The reason, Paul shared, was the Gentiles who — poor in their own right demonstrated a sincere act of brotherly love by taking up a collection benefitting Jewish believers in Jerusalem. He gladly accepted the travel delay as prompted by the Holy Spirit.



Paul shows us in this passage that he didn't see serving the poor as a distraction. It was, instead, <u>a demonstration of commitment to the</u> <u>gospel's message</u>. It was an outpouring of his own discipleship. In Galatians 2:10, Paul describes having an "eager" posture when it came to the needs of the poor.

Cru[®] Inner City carries the same posture. **We focus on this space because Jesus called us here.** We are committed to what Christ calls the Great Commandment, to love God and to love your neighbor.

This foundational commandment is the bedrock of the Great Commission to make disciples of all nations. It addresses heart attitudes, including the sins of prejudice, narcissism, materialism, sexism, and racism. When we view the world as Jesus does, through the filter of the Great Commandment, those sins pale in comparison as we can now clearly see poor image bearers as Imago Dei, regardless of skin color or economic and social status.

That's the same view that prompts strangers to interrupt their own holiday plans to provide a hearty, spontaneous meal for someone in need.
